40 DAYS—Choose Life is a quiet, prayerful vigil for the healing of our land.

Daily Vigils from Sept 27-Nov 5 from 9:30-11:00 am

Pre-Vigil Evening on Sept 26, 7pm at Sacred Heart Cathedral, 3rd and Nicola.

Mission: To gather together the Christian community in prayer, to ask God for the healing of our land from the culture of death, and to witness to all that we need to return to a culture of life.

Biblical Foundation: Deuteronomy 30:19: "*Now choose life so that you and your children may live and that you may love the Lord your God.*" God uses 40-day periods to transform His people - from Noah in the flood to Moses on the mountain to the disciples after Christ's Resurrection.

Available: Signs to hold as well as prayer and meditation sheets to guide.

Directions: There will be opportunities for supporting other pro-life charities throughout the 40 days.

Here are the reasons why I joined pro-life: I have personally experienced the pain. And it still haunts me to this day. I also know other women that have gone through this. I am so very grateful God has called me to get on board and commit to use my God-given voice to help activate the necessary communication that tells people abortion and euthanasia are wrong in every way! This is what I learned from the pain of abortion: it's been a very long grieving process and I finally learned to forgive myself because I turned my eyes to Jesus and He forgives me, so I forgive myself for giving in to the pressure that was placed on me by my mother and doctor to abort my baby. I pray that people will stop putting pressure on women to have abortions. I pray forgiveness to those who have pressured women to the point where they see no other choice, because ADOPTION is always the BETTER choice, instead of abortion. To this day, I still don't know why my Mom insisted that I abort my baby, her grandchild. But at the time, I was feeling so vulnerable and really seeking my Mom's approval and just wanting her to like me even just a little bit. So I did what I was pressured to do. When I woke up, never have I felt more empty and alone than I did that day. I thank God for His forgiveness and understanding because every morning His mercies are new and His compassion fails not. The lesson that I learned from the pain of abortion is that I will not worry about gaining anyone's approval, except for the approval from my Heavenly Father who loves me unconditionally, just as I am.

My name is Maureen Lefebvre. I have lived most of my life in Kamloops and have been prolife for almost 40 years. When I became a Christian in 1985 I wanted to "do" Christianity properly. It seemed that many Christians I saw had a cause they worked at. Since I had several committed prolife friends, that's where I began volunteering. Working in the office, as I read the stories I was filing, my heart was broken for the defenseless unborn. I have been committed to the injustice ever since. ...Coming to Kamloops, my involvement with the pro-life community continued to increase. My youth group volunteered at banquets hosted by the Kamloops Pro-Life Society, and I would assist at more community events as well. During Covid, some restrictions were put in place, but there were still a few events I could participate in. These included putting up flags in a display outside Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, and attending the Friday prayer vigils by the hospital. One of the last ones happened on Good Friday during my Grade 12 year. The solemnity of that day made that vigil an incredibly powerful experience.

In university, the business of student life has made it harder to participate with the local pro-life community. However, I have received multiple opportunities to witness to my beliefs in daily life. The most profound of these opportunities has been a conversation with a friend that occurred this year. We were having a different conversation when the topic turned to euthanasia. Instead of being nervous that I didn't know as much about it compared to abortion, I was still able to articulate my beliefs in a non-judgmental manner. Although I am still a little afraid to share my pro-life stance, I am gradually becoming bolder...

Nate Amy, \$500 Scholarship winner

...One of the earliest experiences that influenced my pro-life beliefs was when my aunt and uncle's daughter was born with Down syndrome. For three months, Jolene was at BC Children's Hospital in Vancouver. My family and I made frequent trips to see her during this time. While there, I observed other children who also needed medical attention to survive. This opened my eyes to how



delicate and fragile life is and the importance of valuing every human being, regardless of their abilities or disabilities.

...My commitment to pro-life values extends beyond my individual encounters and into the realm of politics. I hold firmly that every human being is entitled to life, including fetuses. It is integral for me to support laws safeguarding unborn children's rights while granting each child a chance at full development without obstacles. Further, it remains imperative for me to provide

mothers with useful resources when facing unplanned pregnancies and support them through their decision-making process as they choose life for their offspring.

...I head a Christian club here at the university and abortion is one of the topics that comes around and the discussions are normally lengthy. I believe that every life should be protected and that babies have a great future and purpose, and they should be given the opportunity to live irrespective of their parent's socioeconomic condition or position. Growing up in Kenya has really helped me appreciate the fact that children can come

from a humble or poor background and rise to become helpful people in society. In Kenya, the southern part of Kenya known as Kajiado, I saw children who were starving, dehydrated, and ill from all kinds of sickness like kwashiorkor, marasmus, and anemia. Due to the conservative culture in the region, the parents and the community came together to share the little food that they had to support their children from dying from hunger. The parents did not think of aborting the unborn child due to hard economic situations but saw the unborn child as a hope for the future.

I am planning hopefully by late summer and early Fall to start a pro-life club here at Thompson Rivers University. The club will serve the purpose of educating students, faculty, and staff and also advocate for pro -life policies in Kamloops and Canada as a whole. I am planning to lay a good groundwork and look for a team that is passionate about Pro-life and that we will work together.
